Conducts floodplain delineation studies to inform communities and their citizens of flood hazards

Ensure floodplains are identified and updated for all communities to use for floodplain management

Communities request studies from the Flood Control District

Why is the floodplain being revised?


The current floodplain identifies some buildings as being within a floodway.

The County received comments from property owners and the City of Phoenix during the Cudia City Wash Area Drainage Master Study


City of Phoenix asked the Flood Control District to determine if the floodway could be revised on the FEMA maps.

Floodplain was evaluated from State Route 51 to the Arizona Canal Diversion Channel





What are the results?



- In certain locations the floodplain and floodway were reduced. Some areas were removed from the floodplain
- Specific changes are provided on the next slide








Myrtle Avenue Wash Floodplain Delineation Study Proposed Changes to the 100-Year Floodplain

FCD anticipates submitting Floodplain Package to FEMA It is anticipated that there will be a 1-Year FEMA Review & Approval FEMA issues the new map. FEMA offers a 90-day Appeal Period. If no appeals received the map goes into effect
