



METRO PHOENIX AREA DRAINAGE MASTER STUDY/PLAN UPDATE

The Flood Control District of Maricopa County is conducting a regional drainage master study in partnership with the City of Phoenix. This drainage study will identify flooding problems and develop strategies to reduce flood hazards within metro Phoenix. Once completed, the study will be used to budget future drainage improvement projects.

The original Metro Phoenix Area Drainage Master Plan (ADMP) identified and recommended solutions. These included the construction of several basins and storm drain systems to decrease flooding hazards within the identified problem areas. Since the completion of that study in 2008, there has been development changes as well as new infrastructure built within the watershed.

The Metro ADMP Update will:

- Create a database of known flooding and drainage problems.
- Develop state-of-the-art models using new aerial mapping.
- Assess flooding hazard and previously proposed solutions.
- Restudy the metro Phoenix floodplains.
- Prepare a plan to provide potential solutions for flood-prone areas.



Study Area:

The Metro Phoenix ADMS/P Update focus area is located mostly within the City of Phoenix; however, it also includes portions of the cities of Scottsdale and Tempe along its eastern end. The study area is approximately 90 square miles and predominately covers the developed part of Phoenix. The study boundary is outlined on the attached map.

How Could the Study Affect You?

The results of this study will be used to provide awareness of flood hazards and risks for residents to be better prepared and make informed choices to reduce their risk of flooding. This study will also reassess and refine existing proposed solutions using updated computer modeling tools.
